 Minnesota only had a Standard Driver's License - what is now known as a "Non-REAL ID compliant driver's license" All Minnesotans could obtain a driver's license regardless of citizenship status 	 Governor unilaterally amends Department of Public Safety administrative rules to remove driver's licenses from tens of thousands of noncitizen Minnesotans 	 Minnesota creates a new Enhanced Driver's License that requires more documentation because it affords greater access than a Standard Driver's License to air travel, federal buildings, and border crossings. 	 Minnesota creates a new REAL ID Driver's License as required for federal law that requires more documentation than a Standard Driver's License but less than an Enhanced Driver's License because it too provides access to air travel and federal buildings.
